As of now, several bottlenecks are hindering the free movement of people, goods and services, especially related to trade activities along the Nacala corridor. A One-Stop Border Post (OSBP) at the Mwami/Mchinji border will be built to improve this unfortunate situation. The OSBP will have two separate facilities one on either side of the international boundary line that require only one stop for vehicles and pedestrians in each direction.</p>
