## PROTECTION OF YOUR PERSONAL DATA

**Processing operation:** 21st European Remembrance Day for Victims of Terrorism

Data Controller: European Commission, Directorate-General for Home and Migration Affairs

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#### 1. Introduction

The European Commission is committed to protect your personal data and to respect your privacy. The Commission collects and further processes personal data pursuant to Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data.

This privacy statement explains the reason for the processing of your personal data in the context of the **21st European Remembrance Day for Victims of Terrorism**, organised by the European Commission. It explains the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you have in relation to your personal data. It also specifies the contact details of the responsible Data Controller with whom you may exercise your rights, the Data Protection Officer and the European Data Protection Supervisor.

The information in relation to the processing of personal data linked to the abovementioned event organised by the Directorate-General for Home and Migration Affairs (DG HOME) – Unit D.3 (Prevention of Radicalisation) of the European Commission is presented below.

# 2. Why and how do we process your personal data?

<u>Purpose of the processing operation</u>: the European Commission collects and further processes your personal data to provide you with information about the specific event (before, during and after) and to process your application for participation in that event.

Your personal data will not be used for any automated decision-making including profiling.

Live web-streaming and audio-visual recording at the Conference of the speakers, organisers and participants, as well as photographs of the speakers and panoramic photographs of participants and organisers will be taken and published in the context of the "21st European Remembrance Day for Victims of Terrorism" at the Conference website, the restricted Wiki and Europe by Satellite. The live streaming will be recorded and available for replay for 2 years.

The audience or non-speaker participants are not photographed individually or in groups. They may however appear on panoramic photographs of the whole event/audience.

Please note that if you decide to take photographs/audio-visual recordings of participants of the meeting and/or publish them online, you assume full responsibility for these actions. The same applies if you download the photographs that will be shared with participants or posted on the European Commission online platforms and publish them on the Internet. The data controller shall not be held accountable for any processing of personal data that you might carry out on your own initiative during or after the event.

## 3. On what legal ground(s) do we process your personal data?

The processing operations on personal data, linked to the organisation, management, follow-up and promotion of the event (including web-streaming, and photos) are essential for the management and functioning of the Commission, as mandated by the Treaties. Those provisions are in particular, Article 11 of the Treaty on European Union and Article 15 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union.

Consequently, those processing operations are lawful under Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 (processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Union institution or body).

In addition, we process your personal data based upon Article 5(1)(d), because:

the data subject has given consent to the processing of his or her personal data for one or more specific purposes (see below).

Your consent is required for the following actions during the event (if applicable):

the processing of your personal data relating to your dietary requirements.
the sharing of the meeting or event participants list containing your name and affiliation with other participants / country.
the processing of your personal data for inviting you to future events the data controller may organise;
the processing of your personal data for managing your subscription to a newsletter of the data controller.

If you opt-in, you are giving us your explicit consent under Article 5(1)(d) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 to process your personal data for those specific purposes. You can give your consent via a clear affirmative act by ticking the box(es) on the online registration form.

Please note that the mandatory treatment of your personal data for the secure access to Commission buildings is under data protection record DPR-EC-00655.3 Commission Physical Access Control System (PACS).

## 4. Which personal data do we collect and further process?

The following personal data will be collected and processed in the context of the Conference:

- contact details (function/title, first name, last name, name of organisation, city, country, e-mail address, telephone number);
- date of birth, nationality, passport or identity card number and its date of issue and expiry date may be collected, so that the data subjects may obtain to arrange necessary travel arrangements (for in-person participants).
- dietary requests (if any) or specific access requirements.

The provision of personal data is mandatory to meet the necessary requirements for registration and participation in the event. If you do not provide your personal data, the Commission will not be able to grant you access to the premises/platform of the Conference or arrange your travel and accommodation.

#### 5. How long do we keep your personal data?

The Data Controller only keeps your personal data for the time necessary to fulfil the purpose of collection or further processing.

For each of the categories of personal data that may be processed, please find below the retention details and the reference to the relevant record of processing:

Personal data related to the organisation and management of the Conference (this includes the information given during the registration, before, during or after the event) will be kept for <b>five years</b> after the Conference in accordance with SEC(2019)900 "Common Commission-Level Retention List For European Commission Files".
Sensitive personal data relating to dietary and/or access requirements will be deleted as soon as they are no longer necessary for the purpose for which they have been collected in the framework of the Conference, but no later than within <b>1 month</b> after the end of the meeting or event.
Recordings from the web-streamed meeting or event will be kept for <b>2 years</b> before being deleted. More information is available in the Record of Processing DPR-EC-00306 (Web-streaming of Commission events).
Personal data shared with the Directorate-General for Human Resources and Security of the European Commission for the participants to gain access to Commission buildings is kept <b>for 6 months</b> after the termination of the link between the data subject and the Commission. More information is available in the Record of Processing DPR-EC-00655 (Commission Physical Access Control System (PACS)).
Selected service providers for organisational purposes (such as event management organisations, venues, caterers and/or travel agents) are contractually bound to process personal data on behalf of and in line with the instructions of the data controller, keep confidential any data they process and protect it from unauthorised access, use and retention.

# 6. How do we protect and safeguard your personal data?

All personal data in electronic format (e-mails, documents, databases, uploaded batches of data, etc.) are stored on the servers of the European Commission *and of its contractors*.. All processing operations are carried out pursuant to Commission Decision (EU, Euratom) 2017/46 of 10 January 2017 on the security of communication and information systems in the European Commission.

To protect your personal data, the Commission has put in place a number of technical and organisational measures. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access, taking into consideration the risk presented by the processing and the nature of the personal data being processed. Organisational measures include restricting access to the personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.

The Commission's processors/contractors) are bound by a specific contractual clause for any processing operations of your personal data on behalf of the Commission and by the confidentiality obligations deriving from the General Data Protection Regulation in the EU Member States ('GDPR' Regulation (EU) 2016/679). The processors (service providers) have to put in place appropriate technical and organisational measures to ensure the level of security, required by the Commission.

# 7. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

Access to your personal data is provided to the Commission staff responsible for carrying out this processing operation and to other authorised Commission staff according to the "need to know" principle. Such staff abide by statutory, and when required, additional confidentiality agreements.

Where necessary, we may also share your information with service providers for the purposes of organising the 21st European Remembrance Day for Victims of Terrorism.

The information we collect will not be given to any third party, except to the extent and for the purpose we may be required to do so by law.

#### **Cookies**

Cookies are short text files stored on a user's device (such as a computer, tablet or phone) by a website. Cookies are used for the technical functioning of a website (functional cookies) or for gathering statistics (analytical cookies).

Registration for the Conference takes place via the European Commission tool "EU Survey", which employs cookies. Further information on the cookie policy of the Commission is available here: <a href="https://commission.europa.eu/cookies-policy">https://commission.europa.eu/cookies-policy</a> en

When you visit the registration page and the website of the Conference and when you register, we will indicate in the specific privacy statement how long we will keep the browser history of your visit. This information will then be deleted. The collection, aggregation and anonymising operations are performed in the data centre of the European Commission under adequate security measures.

Cookies are stored by Europa Analytics, the corporate service which measures the effectiveness and efficiency of the European Commission's websites on EUROPA. More information is available in the Record of Processing DPR-EC-00685 (Europa Analytics).

Enabling these cookies is not strictly necessary for the website to work but it will provide you with a better browsing experience. You can delete or block these cookies, but if you do that, some features of the meeting/event website may not work as intended.

The cookie-related information is not used to identify data subjects personally and the pattern data is fully under the Commission's control. These cookies are not used for any purpose other than those described here.

Should you wish to opt your personal data out of our anonymised, aggregated statistics, you can do so on our cookies page. In particular, you can control and/or delete those cookies as you wish.

#### Third party IT tools, including Social Media

We will use third party IT tools (YouTube, Twitter) to inform about and promote the Conference through widely used communication channels, including the social media. For detailed information about the use of social media by the European Commission, see the Record of Processing DPR-EC-00073 (Social Media Use by the European Commission).

You may be able to watch our videos, which may be also uploaded to one of our social media pages and follow links from our website to other relevant social media.

In order to protect your privacy, our use of third-party IT tools to connect to those services does not set cookies when our website pages are loaded on your computer (or other devices), nor are you immediately redirected to those social media or other websites. Only in the event that you click on a button or "play" on a video to watch it, a cookie of the social media company concerned will be installed on your device. If you do not click on any social media buttons or videos, no cookies will be installed on your device by third parties.

In order to view such third-party content on our websites, a message will alert you that you need to accept those third parties' specific Terms and Conditions, including their cookie policies, over which the Commission has no control.

We recommend that users carefully read the relevant privacy policies of the social media tools used. These explain each company's policy of personal data collection and further processing,

their use of data, users' rights and the ways in which users can protect their privacy when using those services.

The use of a third-party IT tool does not in any way imply that the European Commission endorses them or their privacy policies. In the event that one or more third party IT tools are occasionally unavailable, we accept no responsibility for lack of service due to their downtime.

# 8. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in particular the right to access, your personal data and to rectify them in case your personal data are inaccurate or incomplete. Where applicable, you have the right to erase your personal data, to restrict the processing of your personal data, to object to the processing, and the right to data portability.

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data, which is lawfully carried out pursuant to Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 on grounds relating to your particular situation.

The European Commission will ensure that the data subjects can exercise their right to object to processing whenever possible by the organisers of the meeting/event (for example, on the spot by indicating a non-web streamed seat if requested; or ex-post, by deleting a specific sequence from the online video/voice recording).

You have consented to provide your personal data for the present processing operation. You can withdraw your consent at any time by notifying the Data Controller. The withdrawal will not affect the lawfulness of the processing carried out before you have withdrawn the consent.

You can exercise your rights by contacting the data controller, or in case of conflict the Data Protection Officer. If necessary, you can also address the European Data Protection Supervisor. Their contact information is given under Heading 9 below.

Where you wish to exercise your rights in the context of one or several specific processing operations, please provide their description (i.e. their Record reference(s) as specified under Heading 10 below) in your request.
